Council President Murphy called the meeting to order at 7:06 PM.

Councillor O'Malley explained this paper was inspired by the number of storage facilities coming online around the city. Although there is a need for these facilities, they don't do much to enrich the community, do not contribute to long-term employment, and encourages a transient nature of short-term residency. The goal of the city should be to encourage homeownership.

Councillor Linehan warned of what a city zones for in light industrial areas can affect the local job force, affordability, crowding out of locally owned businesses and so she supports looking at this zoning for future consideration of the direction of the city. Multiple councillors agreed with these points and paper was unanimously supported for further evaluation.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Ordinance be referred to a joint session of Rules & Ordinance Committee with Planning Board. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Councillor O'Malley introduced this paper stating he wants to be certain the Council is moving forward in an appropriate way regarding preserving/revising the Charter and welcomed discussion from the Body.

Councillor Winslow invited Assistant City Solicitor Zaheer Samee to the podium where Attorney Samee then explained there are two directions a city may go when revising Charter. One is by special act of the legislature and the other is electing a local Charter Commission (M.G.L. c. 43b). The special act of the legislature is the choice this Body has chosen and has been in contact with the local delegation. Council President Murphy explained the Council had been advised that their recommendations for any revisions would be submitted to the legislature and then the state would let the city know if the amendments could be moved forward or if they were so substantive a ballot question was necessary.

Councillor McDonald stated he would welcome an overview of the limitations of the process. Attorney Samee said the Legal Department would be happy to provide further information on the two different avenues available to the Council for this process. With this, the Council was happy to place Paper 199 on file.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Simonelli, that the Order be placed on file. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Councillor McDonald expressed his desire to highlight some important strategic work that went into Papers 174 and 175 through weekly meeting across multiple departments that included Engineering, Water, Public Works, Tree Warden, with representatives from utility companies to optimize how all these different projects for underground repairs, inclusion of tree pits, etc. are coordinated with the street paving. Councillor Winslow spoke on behalf of all the funding sources that are going into the Trafton Park Improvement Project in addition to this \$160,000 from the Community Preservation Act Fund. Features of the park will include park benches, water fountains for both people and dogs, player benches in the tennis and basketball area, one of the tennis courts will be converted into a basketball court and play area, irrigation, trees in the dog park, and lighting upgrades.

Discussion began with Councillor Winslow explaining the process, allowable through Robert's Rules of Order, to set a timeline for a full vote by announcing a notice of intent to discharge a committee if the timeline is not met. He explained that this paper is not a reflection of how Chair McDonald is running his committee, but Councillor Winslow was concerned during the last Finance meeting where there were proposals that were outside the order of what was reasonable to ask of staff given the size and scope of the request on a project that was not part of the paper being considered. Especially, too, with the budget season coming up, he doesn't want Papers 139 and 140 to fall behind. Co-sponsor Councillor Spadafora is also concerned with the time frame involved with these two papers given what he viewed as deliberate stall tactics in past Finance meetings.

As Chair of the Finance Committee, Councillor McDonald said he is mindful of the need to spend time on the upcoming budget and has accounted for that with planning and scheduling of his committee's time and agendas. Currently, Papers 139 and 140 have brought about good conversations within committee but having them come out for a vote of the Full City Council in time for the May 23 agenda was his plan all along and he feels imposing this timeline is unnecessary.

It was the overwhelming consensus of the Council that the Body has faith in the job the Chair is doing with the work presented to Finance Committee and that they are confident the Committee will be able to bring Papers 139 and 140 to a Full Council vote by the May 23 agenda. A compromise was discussed to preserve the right to discharge the committee while also showing respect for Councillor McDonald's efforts with the Roosevelt Project; for that reason, a tabling motion was made.
