Two representatives from National Grid appeared before the Council to petition to enter a sidewalk to install a pad with underground service on Charles Street near pole number 5441. Councillor Crowe has been in communication with the designer of this project and expressed her support, stating this is a fairly easy job and will only disrupt on sidewalk panel. Doing this work via the underground is a better option than having to install potentially two new polls.

Petition granted with the conditions that the Engineer be called when Dig Safe is notified, the streets and sidewalks be restored to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works, and that the sidewalk panel be replaced in whole, not patched, to the satisfaction of the Ward Councillor.

This resolution represents the latest in Malden's ongoing engagement with the Chapter 70 school funding program. Chapter 70 is the largest source of outside funding available to the city and is essential for providing excellent school services but the calculation can be somewhat problematic, making it difficult for cities such as Malden afford their portion. This bill creates a commission to examine and make recommendations on key issues with Chapter 70.

The city's financial team has been researching possible solutions for this problem for approximately three years. Councillor Spadafora wrote an op-ed in last week's newspaper explaining the concerns revolving around Chapter 70 funding and the School Committee is also considering a similar resolve.

The residents of Malden are strongly encouraged to advocate in support of this bill. The city being able to properly fund the school system isn't just a concern for those with school-aged children; this is an issue that effects every person in Malden as it becomes a citywide budget issue. Uncertainty of future federal funds coming into the state could only exacerbate the problem.
