



Malden weathers the storm

The massive hybrid storm from Hurricane Sandy caused a state-of-emergency across Massachusetts and shut down much of Malden on Monday, but local officials say it caused relatively little long-term damage.

The category one hurricane made landfall in New Jersey, but was expected to produce gusts of up to 80 miles per hour on the Bay State coast.

Having spent much of the day in the field and conferring with the city's Emergency Management Team, Mayor Gary Christenson said they were prepared for the worst, but the storm was less powerful than expected and did not cause serious damage.

"Most of the calls coming in were downed tree limbs and lines, and questions about whether the schools were off," said Christenson.

The storm knocked out power for between 1,500-2,000 meters in Malden, said Ron Cochran, who is Christenson's head of communication technology.

"I think that represents 10 to 15 percent of residents," he said, in an e-mail.

The storm closed the schools and all city buildings on Monday. The Malden Public Schools were also closed on Tuesday.

The decision to close the schools a second day was made Monday evening. Superintendent of Schools David DeRuosi, who said officials wanted to give sufficient notice of any cancellation and there were concerns about the
