Councillor McDonald is currently working with CFO Charles Ranaghan to compile a list of potential revenue-generating ideas and have further discussions before the budget cycle to ensure they are prepared for any financial challenges in the next fiscal year. They have scheduled a meeting of the Finance Committee for next Tuesday, March 4 for a discussion of the same as well as long-term budget trends. Master planning, zoning, Chapter 70 funding are all areas that need consideration as a part of the bigger conversation.

Rain Barrel Ordinance Linehan's Edits Feb 25 2025
Final Paper 179-24 Order Regarding Rain Barrels

With consideration to the handout offered by Councillor Winslow on February 11, Councillor Linehan drafted some sample language for an ordinance paper that may be referred to the Full Council to be ordained. This draft is attached to the history of Paper 179-24, entitled Rain Barrel Ordinance Linehan's Edits Feb 25 2025.

During the discussion, two further changes were suggested:

- 1. In paragraph three, strike 'must be no larger than 55 gallons, and' and 'one foot off the ground'. Add 'to allow drainage' after 'securely elevated'.
- 2. In paragraph six, add 'no more than four feet in height' after '10' x 10' in size'. Clerk will update language accordingly and create a paper to present to the Full Council during the meeting of March 11.

A motion was made by Councillor Linehan, seconded by Councillor O'Malley, that the Order be taken from the table. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor Linehan, seconded by Councillor O'Malley, that the Order be recommended favorably to the City Council with amended language to MCC 9.04.010 as drafted in committee. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Be it ordained by the Malden City Council that the Code of the City of Malden (MCC) Title 12, Chapter 12, Section 090, Subsection B. OFFSITE OFF-STREET PARKING LOTS and Title 12, Chapter 20, Section 020, Subsection I. GENERAL OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS is hereby amended as follows:

Purpose of Amendments to 12.12.090 and 12.20.010

The purpose of the proposed amendments to 12.12.090 and 12.20.010 are to address the loss of limited open green space in our environmental justice community while balancing the need to maintain open green space with the need for adequate parking in our community. The necessity of open space requirements is to allow water filtration and ground absorption. Residents of Malden are encouraged to utilize plantings and permeable landscaping materials and avoid materials that may become overly compacted, such as crushed stone or stone dust.

During the discussion, it was agreed to include the language 'Parking shall be prohibited in the landscaped area.' as a means of keeping people from using permeable surfaces as parking spots and to preserve what little green space may be afforded around yards and parking lots.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Ordinance be taken from the table. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Ordinance be amended by inserting 'Parking shall be prohibited in the landscaped area' to the end of 12.12.090.B.5.b. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Ordinance be amended by inserting 'Parking shall be prohibited in the landscaped area' after 'so as to prevent erosion' in 12.20.020.l.5. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Ordinance be recommended favorably as amended to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Dwelling single family: 0.5 per bedroom

Dwelling single family with two kitchens: 0.5 per bedroom

Dwelling two family: 0.5 per bedroom

Dwelling three and four family: 0.5 per bedroom Dwelling town or row house: 0.5 per bedroom

Dwelling, cohousing: 0.5 per bedroom

Councillor O'Malley stated he will be circulating a report to the committee in time for the next conversation on this paper.
