City Planner Michelle Romero appeared before the Council with a brief overview of the process and timeline involved with Malden's MBTA zoning proposal as submitted to the State and the feedback received from the Executive Office of Housing and Livable

Communities.

The application for district compliance was submitted in December 2023; since that time EOHLC came back with two notes to amend the application. Malden is currently in conditional compliance with the law.

The first was regarding the development cap as listed in the ordinance. This is a numerical cap included in the ordinance for one of the sub-districts - Multi-family overlay district called Medium Density 1. Originally, the cap was allowed but the State guidelines have since changed so now the cap must be removed. In doing so, the same unit capacity and maximum potential growth numbers, as required by state law, must be maintained. In removing the numerical cap, the zoning maps will also have to be updated.

The second note was regarding the date of when the ordinance is to take effect. The ordinance currently states it would become effective upon final approval by the State of the City's application. EOHLC informed Malden that is not allowed by law so the ordinance must be amended to show it is effective as to the date the Council ordains the paper.

A motion was made by Councillor Winslow, seconded by Councillor Simonelli, that the Ordinance be referred to a joint public hearing of the Planning Board with Rules and Ordinance Committee. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

172-<u>25</u>

Be it ordained by the Malden City Council that the Code of the City of Malden (MCC) 12.08.040 FLOODPLAINS, 12.12.110 FLOODPLAIN DISTRICTS, 12.32.060 DEFINITIONS -ZONING are hereby amended to include new regulations, as required by FEMA, so that referenced areas will remain eligible for FEMA sponsored flood insurance programs.

Updating this ordinance is necessary because FEMA is updating floodplain maps for Malden in July. The ordinance must reflect those new maps for the areas to remain eligible for FEMA flood control insurance. The State Department of Conservation Recreations Flood Office has sent the city a model ordinance to use for reference. Malden currently has a substantial floodplain ordinance so it should require minimal adjustments.

A motion was made by Councillor Winslow, seconded by Councillor Crowe, that the Ordinance be referred to a joint public hearing of the Planning Board with Rules and Ordinance Committee. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Councillor Winslow expressed to the Council the need for a number of papers to move forward next week based on the timing of certain project deadlines and suggested the Council calendar for the week of April 15 be adjusted to reflect the Committee of the Whole meeting instead be docketed as a Full Council meeting under the authority of Council Rule 1.05.

A motion was made by Councillor Winslow to adjust the Council calendar. seconded by Councillor Simonelli. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of 8-0.

Taking an inventory of unused city owned property to legally designate it as conservation land is a topic that has been ongoing recently in the Public Property Committee. This paper is an extension of those conversations. The challenge to a project such as this is that there are a variety of unique categories that may be designated for open space. Councillor McDonald asked for the Legal Department to provide some clarification of what the different categories are and which law defines them; state, local, constitutional. Councillor O'Malley further noted it would be helpful to have an understanding on the difference between a preservation easement and a conservation easement. The general consensus of the Body is that this paper, fully researched and vetted, could be used as a template for other undeveloped parcels of land throughout the city, in the future.

A motion was made by Councillor Winslow, seconded by Councillor Simonelli, that the Order be adopted. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Proposed CDBG Budget

Director Pratt from OSPCD informed the Council that this budget must be submitted to HUD by May 15. This is also the day that HUD is expected to announce the actual dollar amount that may be expected in the budget. What is presented to be referred to Finance

Committee for further review is a contingency budget based on last year's level funded amount, with anticipated adjustments that may be executed as needed if the final amount comes in higher or lower than anticipated.

Councillor Simonelli opined that projected CDBG funding conversations should be ongoing throughout the year with the Council's involvement, as was done in years past. He explained there previously existed a Community Development Committee wherein the Council followed projects through the various stages of development and were able to suggest help and resources for bringing in other funding options.

Councillor McDonald offered the Council does now have a Community Engagement and Inclusion Committee and wondered if they may be willing to have a community conversation to promote such ideas and projects.

Mayor's Letter of Support 2 6 2025

Prior to discussion on Paper 74-25, Council President O'Malley made a statement of disclosure to the Body regarding his relationship with St. Paul's Parish. Councillor O'Malley is a current parishioner at this church and in the past had held a position of leadership. A written disclosure of an appearance of a conflict of interest is on file in the City Clerk's Office. Councillor O'Malley stated he is capable of voting on this paper without bias. Hearing no dissent from the rest of the Body, the discussion was handed to Councillor McDonald to speak on behalf of the Finance Committee.

Councillor McDonald reported this paper was held up in committee for thoughtful review as it is an order to grant tax-payer funded money to a religious building; however St. Paul's is also a historical building that hosts many secular, community-based events. The Finance Committee requested an opinion from the Legal Department, which was received and discussed at length. Community Preservation Committee funds have been used in other municipalities for church restoration projects. The CPC Association has issued guidance on this topic. And the same was also the subject of a lawsuit wherein

the Supreme Judicial Court offered standards to consider.

The committee recognizes the Constitution protects free exercise of religion and that it would not be appropriate or permissible to reject an application on the sole basis the petitioner is a religious organization. Preference cannot be given, but neither may discrimination, based on religious standing. Alternately, the Anti Aid Amendment requires municipalities not use public funds to support private purposes. All of these points were given consideration with this paper. Ultimately, the grant was requested for the outside of the building hence the suggested amendment to the paper to add the additional language added after 'project' "provided that the appropriation is not to be used to repair or restore any item whose sole purpose is religious:"

Councillor Simonelli expressed his strong objections to adopting this order based on church and state separation. He is of the belief public money should not be spent on religious institutions. Assistant City Solicitor Zaheer Samee was asked to the podium to address these concerns. Councillor Simonelli advised the Body to be careful with this vote because there are many houses of worship throughout the City of Malden, and many of them in need of repair. Financial support may not be granted to one, if not all. Councillor Sica made a motion to table this paper until the Council may get further clarity on the issue.
