**Application** 

For the purposes of discussing the implementation of a Do Not Knock Registry, the Committee invited Chief of Police Glenn Cronin to sit in attendance at this evening's meeting. The need for this registry is to counteract the aggressive nature of licensed and unlicensed door to door solicitors throughout the city. The ordinance aims to reduce the stress and inconvenience caused by these aggressive solicitations thereby improving the overall quality of life for residents.

Based on state law, the solicitors' restrictions do not pertain to those individuals canvassing for non-commercial activities such as political campaigning, educational, or religious outreach.

It was explained the enforcement mechanism for the Do Not Knock Registry includes a \$300 fine for violations and the potential for a one-year revocation of permits for repeat offenders. The penalties would be imposed on the companies rather than individual solicitors, ensuring accountability at the organizational level. The primary goal of the enforcement mechanism is to serve as a deterrent to prevent aggressive solicitation practices.

There was a discussion regarding residents owning the responsibility of placing 'no soliciting' signs on their properties in addition to use of the registry. There were questions whether these signs should be optional, strongly recommended, or mandatory to be on the registry. Many options were considered including the city providing placards to give to the homeowner when they sign up for the registry. A motion was made to table the paper pending further consideration on amending this language.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Order be taken from the table. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Order be tabled. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
