6. HEARINGS, PETITIONS, MEMORIALS, AND REMONSTRANCES

The City Council will hold a Public Hearing regarding a Home Rule Petition process to repeal Sections 16, 20, 21, 23A, 23C, 23D, 23F, 23G, and 32 of the Malden City Charter. If passed, these repealed sections from the Charter will be incorporated within the following chapters of the City's ordinances, MCC 2.12, 2.16, 9.16, and 11.

The City Council held a public hearing on a home rule petition to repeal certain sections of the Malden City Charter and incorporate them into city ordinances. Councillor Winslow and Councillor Simonelli spoke in favor of the amendments, highlighting the extensive work done over the past seven years to update the charter.

The Friends of Fellsmere Heights submitted a letter opposing the proposed charter changes, recommending modifications to retain certain organizations in the charter and ensure no lapses in the city's authority and responsibilities. This letter is now attached to the history of papers 443-24 and 219-25
