Mayor's Ordinance Proposal Letter 1 29 24

Chair Linehan opened discussion by turning the meeting over to Councillor Spadafora to introduce the paper, as he sponsored it. The purpose of increasing the amount outlined in this ordinance from \$500 to \$25,000 is to keep pace with inflation. Claims for reimbursement of damages in today's dollars are significantly higher than \$500 and the higher threshold will allow the Solicitor greater negotiating power to settle valid claims without causing the city's residents to initiate a court case. Councillor Spadafora argued that \$25,000 seems like a very large increase but it is not an unreasonable range considering the cost of goods and services to fix damaged property.

Controller Ranaghan added the \$25,000 number came about through several conversations considering amounts ranging from \$10,000 to \$50,000. Solicitor McNeil is comfortable with \$25,000, stating any claims higher than that should go through the process of court action.

Councillor Crowe made a motion to amend the paper by adding, "Claims exceeding \$25,000 but not more than \$50,000 may be settled by the City Solicitor subject to the approval of the Committee on Finance."

A motion was made by Councillor Crowe, seconded by Councillor O'Malley, that the Ordinance be amended. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Councillor O'Malley, seconded by Councillor Crowe, that the Ordinance be recommended favorably as amended to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

-In Section D.1: striking 'office' and replace with residence
