CCP 227 2023 PBR 7.23 wAtts

This proposal is to eliminate drive-thrus in the Neighborhood Business and Central Business zoning districts. They will continue to be allowed in Highway Business, Industrial 1, and Industrial 2 by Special Permit. During their public hearing of July 17, 2023 the Planning Board recommended only approving the part striking drive-thrus from Neighborhood Business but keeping them in Central Business. Councillor Crowe reported on behalf of the Rules and Ordinance Committee that they were in agreement with the Planning Board recommendation as a satisfactory compromise.

A motion was made by Councillor Crowe, seconded by Councillor O'Malley, that the Ordinance be enrolled as amended to the City Council. The motion carried by the following vote:

Committee Report: The Standing Committee on Rules and Ordinance, to whom was referred Paper 304 Series of 2023, having considered the same make the following report: Committee recommends that this paper be referred out favorably, as amended, to the Full Council.

A motion was made by Councillor Crowe, seconded by Councillor Linehan, that the Committee Report be received and filed. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

Be it ordained by the Malden City Council that the Code of the City of Malden (MCC) 2.20.020 Elected Officials Salary Classification Plan be hereby amended to reflect the following compensation levels to be effective January 1, 2024.

Councillor Crowe spoke on behalf of this paper stating first that the salaries for Mayor, Council, School Committee have not changed since 2006. This paper represents what would have been a 2% annual increase between 2006-2023. The only amendment that was made by the Rules and Ordinance Committee was to include a \$3,000 stipend to the position of Council President to accommodate the additional workload and lost wages from full time employment that occurs while the President is tending to city business. A similar amendment was made by the Finance Committee for the accompanying Paper 305-23, which funds this ordinance change and amendment.
