Final Paper 426-24 Maplewood Park Turf Rehabilitation Appropriation

Ron Hogan gives a brief summary of the paper to the committee. Maplewood Park is a the point where it needs to be replaced and it is a matter of how we go about doing it. Steve O'Neil, Consultant Hayner/Swanson, Inc. put together in 2022 a probable cost which would remove and replace the turf and reconfigure the field for better use. The number was a little over \$2.2mill as an estimate of construction cost plus soft costs and engineering costs. They drew that number forward and some of the increases in the last 2 plus years brought the new figure to an estimate of \$2.5mill. The committee is in favor of this project.

The Finance Committee will invite staff from the Office of Strategic Planning and Community Development to appear in committee to present an update on the status of all funding sources regarding the remediation of soil at Roosevelt Park.

Councillor McDonald invited Debbie Burke and Alex Pratt from OSPCD to give a brief update on the Roosevelt Park Project. On November 14, 2024 they gave a very comprehensive presentation on this project. Debbie Burke said they did not make a formal presentation for this evening because they don't have any new information since that meeting but there is one caveat for the project. They have written to HUD and asked if they can redefine the project that they had applied for the \$1.2mill Section 108 loan to see if it could be used for the project they have today which is the remediation of the soil within the confines of the fence. She said it would be wise to ask Dan Grover, Treasurer, Ron Hogan, Strategic Planner and Charles Ranaghan, Controller/CFO, the financial questions.

Councillor Taylor said her only question is are we going again to HUD for the \$1.2 mill if that is possible and how long do you estimate the turnaround for the answer? Alex Pratt said we had a conversation with HUD and they were receptive to the idea and they wanted all the details. We are asking if we could narrow the scope of that loan to focus on the hazard soil remediation effort. They indicated on the phone that they think we can get to where we want to go provided it qualifies for those loans based on all sorts of Federal criteria and we wrote to them with the information on the project which shows it does. He projects hearing back from them sometime in early January or late December.
