55-19Be it ordained that Chapter 9 of the Revised Ordinances of 1991 be<br/>amended relative to storage of Solid Waste.

Be it hereby Ordained by the Malden City Council that Chapter 9 of the Revised Ordinances of 1991, as amended, be further amended as follows: In Section 9.27 (Definitions Applicable to All Waste), by striking out the first two sentences of the definition of "receptacles" and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Recycling bins and approved trash bags, which have been placed in barrels which are watertight, have tight fitting lids, are rust resistant and structurally sound and easily filled, emptied and cleaned."

In Section 9.28 (Standards and Regulations), by adding after the words "approved trash bags" as appearing in the fourth paragraph of Subsection A (Residential Waste) the words "stored in barrels"

In Section 9.28 (Standards and Regulations), by adding after the words "properly ties or secured" as appearing in the first sentence of Subsection B 2 (Solid Waste Collection by City Collector) the words "and stored in barrels".

57-19 Committee Report: Communication from the Planning Board Re: CCP# 509-18 (Be it hereby Ordained that Chapter 12 of the R.O. of 1991, as amended, be further amended relative to allowing multifamily dwellings only up to seven stories.)

Be it hereby Ordained that Section 300.1.1 of Chapter 12 of the R.O of 1991 be amended to read:

"Except for residential use "dwelling, multifamily, more than 6 stories but not to exceed 7 stories," where special permit shall be required by the City Council in accordance with Section 300.10 (all structures more than six stories), for all uses where a special permit is required, as indicated by the letter "SP", may be allowed only by Special Permit granted by the Planning Board in conformance with the following controls."

Be it hereby Ordained that Section 300.3.2.7 of Chapter 12 of the R.O. of 1991 be amended by striking "Dwelling, multifamily, more than 6 stories but not exceeding 12 stories." And inserting "Dwelling, multifamily, more than 6 stories but not exceeding 7 stories."

Be it hereby Ordained that Section 300.3.2.8 of Chapter 12 of the R.O. of 1991 be amended by eliminating in its entirety the use category, "Dwelling, Multifamily, more than 12 stories."

Be it hereby Ordained that Section 400.1.2.7 of Chapter 12 of the R.O. of 1991 be amended by striking "Dwelling, multifamily, more than 6 stories but not more than 12 stories." And inserting "Dwelling, multifamily, more than 6 stories but not more than 7 stories."

58-19 Committee Report: Communication from the Planning Board Re: CCP# 521-18 (Be it hereby ordained that Section 700.1.3.1 of Chapter 12, Revised Ordinances of 1991 as amended, be further amended to add the following language.)

700.1.3.1

Except in the case of the conversion or change of use of an existing building containing more than three stories, no residential conversion to a multifamily dwelling greater than three stories is allowed; there shall be no variance of this provision.
