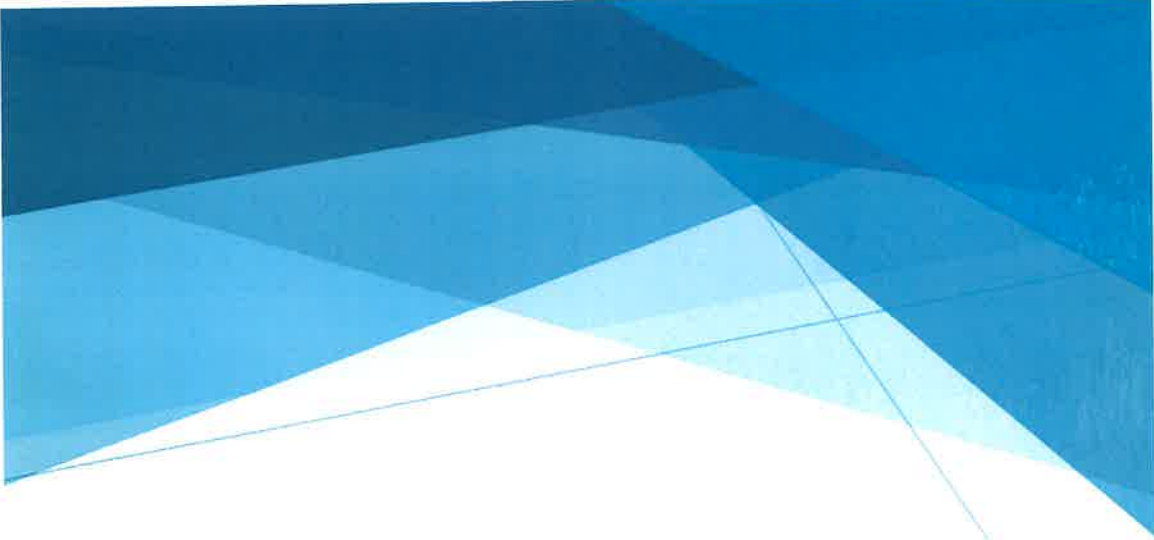
The MYC uplifts youth voices and increases civic engagement. You will learn about City government firsthand by working in collaboratively with city officials, likeminded youth and community partners.



History

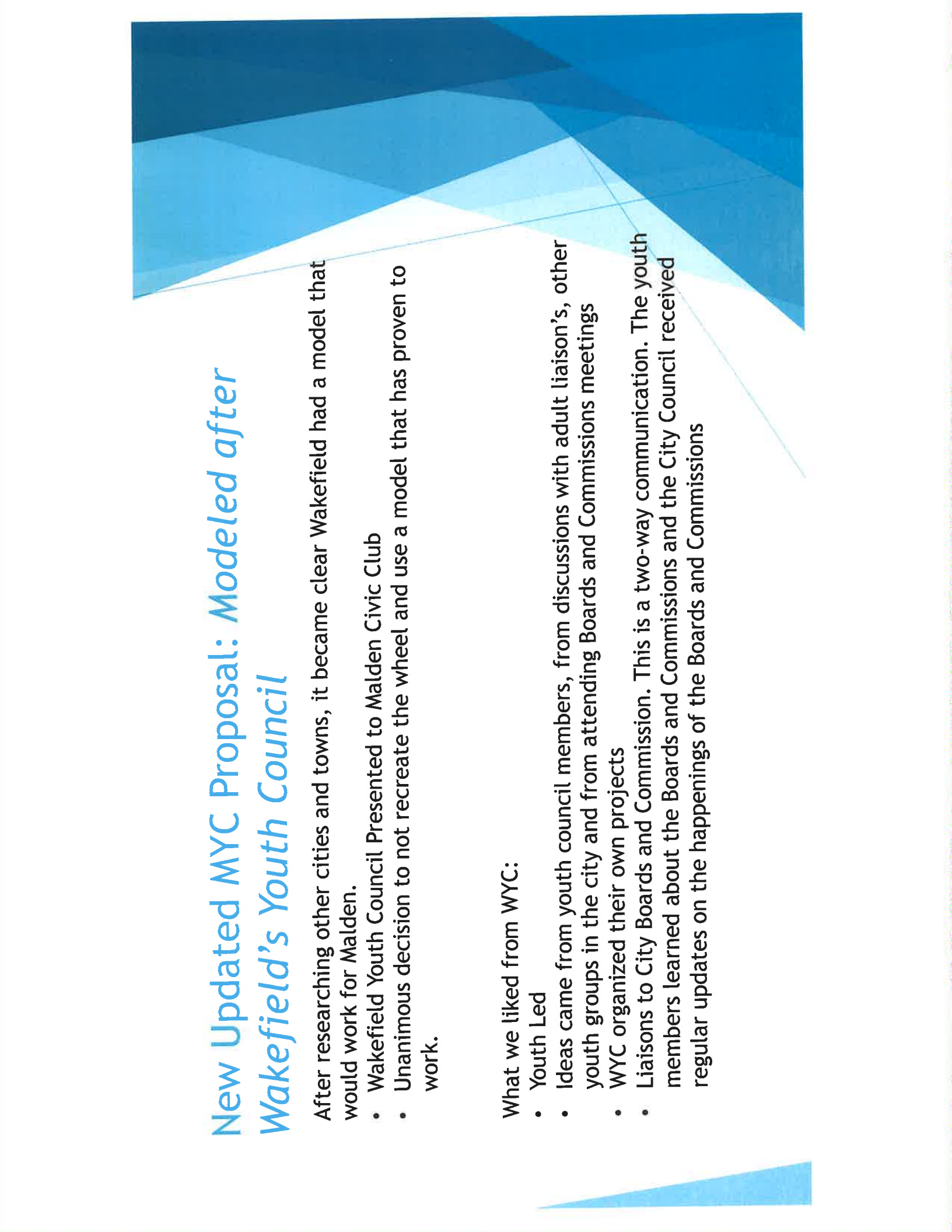
3/29/22 Resolve: That the City of Malden City Council establish “The Malden Youth Council” (MYC) Ad Hoc Committee with three (3) City Councillors as voting members assigned by the Council President; to provide an opportunity for the youth of Malden and foster civic engagement and an opportunity to be involved and participate in local government to acquire a greater knowledge of and appreciation for local government through active participation in the system. Gives Youth a voice at the table. Sponsored by Councillors Colón Hayes, Linehan & McDonald

- Motion by Simonelli to table for more information and to address concerns by some councillors
- Malden Civics' Club has taken lead for the development of the MYC.
- MYC has presented updates to the City Council twice since March of 2022.
- MYC meets regularly and has worked on implementing suggestions from the City Council, MTECH Director and Mayor.
- I attend the MCC when needed to strategize rework our original plan.
- Meeting with Wakefield Youth Council and Catherine Dhingra (Health and Human Services Department-Prevention, Outreach, Youth Services)



Comments from City Council Members

- Concern Youth Council would overlap with other youth groups (YMCA, YWCA, MTECH, etc.)
 - Concern it would take too much time from City Councillors, busy schedule
 - Original presentation had a possible stipend for youth which has since been taken out of the proposal.
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New Updated MYC Proposal: Modeled after Wakefield's Youth Council

After researching other cities and towns, it became clear Wakefield had a model that would work for Malden.

- Wakefield Youth Council Presented to Malden Civic Club
- Unanimous decision to not recreate the wheel and use a model that has proven to work.

What we liked from WYC:

- Youth Led
- Ideas came from youth council members, from discussions with adult liaison's, other youth groups in the city and from attending Boards and Commissions meetings
- WYC organized their own projects
- Liaisons to City Boards and Commission. This is a two-way communication. The youth members learned about the Boards and Commissions and the City Council received regular updates on the happenings of the Boards and Commissions

Wakefield's Background & Vision

Goals:

The Wakefield Youth Council is a platform for Wakefield residents ages 13-18 to serve as youth leaders empowered to share policy ideas and youth comment in the community.

Wakefield Youth Council members will:

- learn the process to effectively advocate
- be engaged in town issues
- actively participate in local government
- communicate and advocate for youth issues in the appropriate forum(s)
- represent a cross-section of the town's neighborhoods, sexes, races/ethnicities, sexual orientations, gender identities, and ages
- implement projects that will benefit the town's youth population, schools, and the community at large



Wakefield Youth Council Expectations

As a fully-appointed committee of the Town, Youth Council Members will:

- Meet at least monthly in duly posted meetings.
- Maintain meeting minutes
- Elect a Chair, Vice Chair, and Clerk
- Create Agendas including public participation so any non-member youth or adults can present issues for the Council's consideration
- Assign liaisons to other Town Committees or Departments Report at least annually to the Town Council on activities.
- Invite town leaders to their meetings to engage in conversation regarding Town government issues and process.

Liaison Positions

Having liaison positions greatly benefits the Youth Council for various reasons, mainly consisting of:

- It allows members of the council to communicate with and advocate for the Youth Council with other town boards, committees, and councils
- It allows members to transmit important information to and from their liaison positions to the Youth Council
- It gives members opportunities to give presentations on the overviews of their liaison positions at our meetings
- It allows members to influence the decision making and communication process of the council regarding details that their board, commission, or council works with

Communications

- Important Communications from Advisor or Chair (Come via Email and/or Remind Text)
- Communicate with other Youth Council Members (text or email)
- How do we communicate with other Youth Groups in the city for collaboration?
- How do we communicate with the public as Youth Council Members?
- How do we communicate with other town and community entities?
