Dear Members of the City Council:

I submit for your consideration an amendment to ordinance Section 2.08.040 Enumeration of Boards and Commission Appointed Officers; Terms and Duties that expands the number of members on the Disability Commission.

As you know, Malden is fortunate to have an active Disability Commission that is committed to making sure that persons of all abilities have equal access to city facilities, services and programs. Most recently, their advocacy has led to a \$40,000 grant that has allowed us to move forward with updating the City's Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan. A copy of their Annual Report is attached that further details some of the other important work and initiatives they have accomplished in such a short time.

The Commission currently consists of five (5) members and the group has asked that we expand the membership to nine (9) members. I am attaching the correspondence I received from Nichole Mossalam, Chair of the Commission, making this request. I believe this will help increase their capacity to carry out their mission while offering other interested residents the chance to serve. Massachusetts General Law, c. 40, §8J, which the City Council adopted in 2018 to form the Commission, allows for "not less than 5 and not more than 13" members. However, to accommodate the request we need to amend the number that is established in our ordinance.

Please let me know if you need any additional information and thank you for your attention to this matter.
