Diana Cuddy represented National Grid at the public hearing and explained that originally the station was going to be closer to Bell Rock Park but changed to the proposed location at Green Street. There were complications with the Bell Rock location.

Councillor Crowe stated that she has a concern with Green Street because its an elderly building and having sidewalks that are accessible is important. Councillor Crowe said the station would make it unsafe for people walking on the sidewalk. Councillor Crowe asked if the company could find a better location.

Ms. Cuddy answered that there is some flexibility but the box has to be close to the pipe but will go back to the company for an alternate sight.

Councillor Murphy stated it sounds like Councillor Crowe and Ms. Cuddy needs to huddle and find a better location and would make a motion to table.

Chair Murphy said that Ron Hogan came before the Finance Committee to discuss the paper. Chair Murphy continued that there are many repairs needed at the CBD garage but structurally the garage is unsafe and if the repairs are not made to the structure the garage will need to close. The \$1,000,000 bond will at least correct the most dangerous situation.

Councillor O'Malley said he is full support and the garage is a big part of the revitalization of downtown.

Chair Murphy said that the funds for this project is coming from the TNC surcharge where rideshares pay the City 10 cents per ride and this would be the accumulation of those funds. Chair Murphy continued that the Council made the decision that instead of dividing the funds through 8 wards, they would pick bigger projects to fund. Because of Covid, this amount is 2 years worth of funds.

Councillor Linehan thanked the Committee and said the neighborhood would be thrilled with the upgrades and this is a great use of the funds. Councillor Linehan continued the improvements will make the intersection a lot safer.

Council President Spadafora agreed with Councillor Linehan and said that he gets a lot of complaints on that intersection.
