Mayor's Letter to the Council re PCAC Ordinance

Chair Crowe opened the meeting with a reading of the paper and then handed it over to Councillor McDonald. He explained the ordinance that is Paper 81 is the product of a couple years of work and community engagement that began with Mayor Christenson's Unite Malden 2020 Pledge after the murder of George Floyd. Through this time, there were many public dialogues, suggestions, a public survey with approximately 1,300 responses, and recommendations that went back to the Mayor on the topic of public safety and policing. The purpose of this advisory group, unlike what is being done in other cities throughout the state, is not to be a civilian oversight group that focuses on investigating misconduct. Massachusetts has a state-wide system in place for that purpose. What this particular group it going to focus on is community involvement between the MPD and residents of Malden, encouraging dialog, reaching out to underrepresented neighborhoods, reviewing of data coming from police department with the ultimate goal of enhancing the trust and relationships involved with the public safety in Malden.

Councillor Spadafora inquired about the Clerk position for this advisory council. He noted there would need to be funding for a stipend for this duty and also pointed out the student representative does not necessarily have to come from Malden High School, only that they are a high school student who resides in the City of Malden.

Chair Crowe asked Chief Cronin if he had anything further to add. He thanked all involved for their work on this project. Chief Cronin stated he has gone through the ordinance many times and doesn't have any issues with anything that is outlined in there and is very much looking forward to working with this advisory council. Special Assistant to the Mayor, Maria Luise spoke to give credit to all who worked on this research group, highlighting their dedication and commitment to this work. Additionally, she noted this ordinance is only one of the recommendations that came out of the work, urging the Councillors and members of the public to read the full recommendations as well as Chief Cronin's response in implementing some of them.

A motion was made by Councillor Winslow, seconded by Councillor at Large Spadafora, that the Ordinance be recommended favorably to the City Council. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
